The North Carolina Community College System (NCCCS) encourages you to hold the date for the 5th annual Minority Male Mentoring Conference. The conference will be held on April 8-10, 2009, at the Sheraton Imperial Hotel and Convention Center in Durham (RTP), North Carolina.

Call for Workshop Proposals 2009 NCCCS Minority Male Mentoring Conference

The North Carolina Community College System is currently seeking proposals for 90-minute breakout sessions for the annual Minority Male Mentoring Conference. The Conference will be held on **April 8-10, 2009.** The conference theme is "A Move towards Change, Inclusion, Leadership, and Success." **The deadline for submitting proposals is Friday, September 12, 2008.** Proposals received after the deadline date may not be reviewed.

Format: Workshop sessions may fit one of three formats: lecture/panel presentation, interactive session, or thematic group discussion.

Theme: "A Move towards Change, Inclusion, Leadership, and Success" Topics should feature best practice strategies/programming and focus primarily on the role of minority males in education and professional success. Presentations should be presented in the following categories: (1) Mentoring, (2) Student Success and Leadership, (3) Professional Development, (4) Program Operation and Funding, (5) Program Assessment and Evaluation, (6) Community and Faith Based Programming, and (7) Health and Family Issues. Examples include, but are not limited to, the following: 1. Branding yourself for an interview, 2. How to create a successful mentoring program, 3. How the lack of fathers affects students in the classroom, or 4. Mentoring student leadership and success.

Benefits: All presenters and panelists are provided with a **complimentary conference registration**. All presenters will gain visibility and recognition of their expertise in the conference brochures, on the website, in the program and other promotional materials. **Please note**: **No fees or honorariums, other than registration, are available for payment to presenters for breakout sessions.**

Proposal Evaluation: Proposals will be evaluated for relevance to theme, community appeal, and potential to fulfill audience and agenda needs. The conference committee reserves the right to place speakers and panelists in compatible sessions and to combine session proposals when appropriate. A limited number of presenters may be asked to repeat presentations during the conference. All those who submit proposals after September 12, 2008, will be notified of their proposal status on or before October 17, 2008.
