11/17/2017	EMS 4500	EMS Education & Admin Level II	This course will prepare individuals to be knowledgeable in areas of EMS course administration, planning, coordination and delivery; curriculum development; staff/instructor supervision; and academic institutional accreditation. Course content will include identifying teaching and learning outcome measures and validating graduate outcome measures as required by licensing and certification agencies. This course is one requirement of the North Carolina Office of EMS to become a Level II EMS instructor.	18	L15 – Emergency Management Services	3	Tracy McPherson

EMS 4500 will replace the current EMS 3001 (EMS Education & Administration) course.

Colleges are expected to use the new EMS 4500 (EMS Education & Admin Level II) course number for course sections starting January 1, 2018.

The current course EMS 3001 (EMS Education & Administration) should not be used for any course section that starts on or after January 1, 2018.

11/17/2017	MLA 3022	Phlebotomy	This course provides theory and clinical experiences needed for the proper collection of blood and other specimens used for diagnostic testing. Emphasis is placed on ethics, legalities, medical terminology, safety and universal precautions, health care delivery systems, patient relations, anatomy and physiology, and specimen collection. Upon completion, students should be able to safely perform procedures necessary for specimen collections on patients in various health care settings and may be eligible for national certification as phlebotomy technicians.	Increase from 200 to 215	L30 – Health Occupations	2	Margaret Roberton

These additional hours (recommended hours 215 and maximum 258) will allow an alignment with the Workforce Continuing Education and Curriculum program training for phlebotomy instruction supporting career pathway development.
