RE: Proposed Amendment of Title 1, Chapter A – "State Board Governance"

The State Board of Community Colleges has initiated the rulemaking process to amend Title 1, Chapter A – "State Board Governance."

The State Board of Community Colleges proposes to amend Title 1, Chapter A – "State Board Governance" to define "service area" and to include the community college service areas in the SBCC Code.

The proposed amendment is published on the NC Community College System's website, www.nccommunitycolleges.edu, under "State Board Code." For your convenience, a copy of the proposed rule, with the changes indicated, is attached to this memorandum. Please post a copy of the proposed rule in prominent places so that all individuals affected by the proposed changes will be informed.

13	The mission of the North Carolina Community College System is to open the door to high quality,
14	accessible educational opportunities that minimize barriers to post-secondary education, maximize
15	student success, and improve the lives and well being of individuals by providing:
16	(1)(a) education, training and retraining for the workforce, including basic skills and literacy
17	education, occupational and pre-baccalaureate programs;
18	(2)(b) support for economic development through services to and in partnership with business
19	and industry; and
20	(3)(c) services to communities and individuals which improve the quality of life.

27	The State Board shall review the priorities of the system and adopt a system-level plan on at least
28	a biennial basis, coordinated with the budget cycle. The plan shall take into account the current
29	and future needs of the system and clarify the priorities essential to carrying out the mission of the
30	system.

7	1A SBCCC 300.1 Definitions
8	The following definitions apply to this Subchapter:
9	(a) Service Area: The geographic area to which the State Board of Community Colleges has
10	assigned community colleges the authority and responsibility to provide education and training
11	services for constituents within that geographic area.
12	(b) Home college: The community college located in the service area in which the military
13	installation is based.

18	1A SBCCC 300. 11A SBCCC 300.2 Establishing Service Areas for Colleges
19	(a) The State Board shall assign service areas to colleges for providing education and training
20	services. The initial assignment of service areas to colleges shall take into account the past
21	and present patterns of providing services, including existing agreements between colleges.
22	The State Board may reassign a service area upon the recommendation of the System President.
23	The recommendation shall be based upon an analysis of the service areas involved, including
24	consultation with the presidents of the colleges and the county commissioners of the
25	county(ies) that are affected.
26	(b) A college may offer education and training in an area assigned to another college using criteria
27	set forth in 1A SBCCC 300.99; 1D SBCCC 300.97; 1D SBCCC 300.6 and 1D SBCCC 400.96.
28	(c) The State Board of Community Colleges shall review, at least every five years, service areas
29	that include counties assigned to more than one community college to determine the feasibility
30	of continuing to assign those counties to more than one community college. The State Board
31	shall revise service areas as needed to ensure that counties are served effectively. The first

1 review and any revisions shall be completed no later than March 1, 2016, and the State Board 2 shall report its findings and any revisions to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight 3 Committee no later than March 1, 2016.
