NC Emergency Manager 101 is one of two parts of the North Carolina Emergency Management Academy designed to provide the initial knowledge and skills needed to perform duties in an entry-level emergency management position in the state of North Carolina. Topics include, but are not limited to, basic concepts in leadership, doctrine, legal authorities, policies, practices, emergency management principles, agency administration, emergency and disaster response, people management, communications and technology. This course focuses on North Carolina as it relates to local, state, federal and private emergency management relationships and operations. It is divided into two courses that are not sequential: NC Emergency Manager 101 and NC Emergency Manager 102. Students will be provided reference materials and tools to assist emergency managers in their new positions. Students are expected to participate in all classroom instruction and exercises. Instructors and curriculum used must be approved by NC Emergency Management. Pre-requisites: IS-700, IS-800, ICS-100, and ICS-200.

HEA 3121	NC Community Health Worker	96	L30 – Health Occupations	2

Description:

This course is designed to provide individuals with the required knowledge, tools, and resources to become recognized as a certified Community Health Worker (CHW) in North Carolina working in a variety of healthcare and community settings (Health Departments, Hospitals, Federally Qualified Health Centers, Clinics, Faith-based Organizations, etc.). Instruction is designed to cover the nine core competencies essential to working as a certified CHW which include communication, capacity building, service coordination, interpersonal, advocacy, outreach, personal/professional skills. The knowledge base competencies will cover health and social issues that disproportionately impact clients including but not limited to chronic diseases such as diabetes, asthma and cancer. Some of the social issues covered will include safety, emergency preparedness, social isolation and adverse childhood experiences (ACES). Students will also learn about the changing health care landscape in North Carolina and how to work with their clients in connecting them to resources through NCCARES 360 and others. Upon completion of this training students will be eligible for listing as a NC Certified Community Health Worker. Course facilitators must complete a train-the-trainer course prior to providing certification instruction.

MSK 3100	Musculoskeletal Sonography	272	L30 – Health Occupations	1A

Description:

This course provides instruction in musculoskeletal (MSK) sonography through classroom, lab and clinical experiences. Topics include anatomy of the upper and lower extremities, normal sonographic appearances, pathological processes, pediatric MSK applications, interventional studies and scanning protocols for the upper and lower extremities. Upon completion, students should be able to recognize and acquire basic MSK images, correlate sonographic images with anatomical structures, recognize pathological processes, and assist with interventional procedures. This course is designed for sonographers in the musculoskeletal sonography field.
