**SUBJECT:** Proposed Amendment of 1D SBCCC 200.93 - Faculty

**DATE:** May 20, 2025

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On May 16, 2025, the State Board of Community Colleges (SBCC) initiated the rulemaking process to amend **1D SBCCC 200.93 – Faculty**. The proposed amendment would replace all references of Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) with “institutional accrediting agency” for faculty standards in hiring and teaching. The proposed amendment is published on the NC Community College System's website, [Numbered Memos - NCCCS \(ncccommunitycolleges.edu\)](https://ncccommunitycolleges.edu). For your convenience, a copy of the proposed rule, with the changes indicated, is attached to this memorandum. Strikethroughs indicate deletions of existing language and underlines indicate additions of language.

Any member of the public has the right to submit written comments on the proposed rule. Please note that any person who submits public comments on behalf of their community college should comply with their college’s local process for submitting comments on a proposed rule. **Written comments on the rule must be received by no later than 5:00 p.m. on June 19, 2025.** Any member of the public has the right to request a hearing on the proposed rule. **Requests for a hearing must be received by no later than 5:00 p.m. on June 4, 2025.**

<b>Rationale for proposed adoption, amendment, or repeal:</b>	Recent North Carolina legislation allows community colleges to use accreditors other than SACSCOC. Updating the State Board Code ensures legal compliance as well as providing clear guidance on accreditor selection and maintain system wide accountability and access to federal funding.

**TITLE 1. COMMUNITY COLLEGES**

**CHAPTER D. EDUCATION PROGRAMS**

**SUBCHAPTER 200. BASIC SKILLS**

**1D SBCCC 200.93 Faculty**

(a) General

(1) Colleges shall employ faculty members ~~so as to meet Southern Association of Colleges and Schools'~~ who meet the established criteria aligned with the institutional accrediting agency.

(2) Colleges shall determine appropriate teaching and non-teaching loads for faculty and for technical assistants to the faculty ~~so as to meet Southern Association of Colleges and Schools'~~ to meet the established criteria of the institutional accrediting agency.

(3) The principles and standards from the institutional accrediting agencies in accordance with North Carolina law are hereby adopted for reference. The Principles of Accreditation: Foundations for Quality Enhancement Commission on Colleges, Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, current edition is hereby adopted by reference, including any subsequent amendments and editions of this book, to apply to community colleges. Copies for The Principles of Accreditation: Foundations for Quality Enhancement may be inspected in or obtained at no cost from the Office of the System President, Department of Community Colleges, 200 W. Jones Street, Raleigh, NC 27603-1379.

(b) Instructors for Extension Emergency Services Training. All instructors in the area of Emergency Services Training must be qualified as established by the respective emergency services certifying agency. Emergency services training means training delivered to personnel in law enforcement, fire and rescue services, and emergency medical services agencies.
