- **SUBJECT:** Proposed Amendment of 1H SBCCC 200.6 Expenditure of State Funds: Accreditation Expenses & Dues
- **DATE:** May 20, 2025

On May 16, 2025, the State Board of Community Colleges (SBCC) initiated the rulemaking process to amend **1H SBCCC 200.6 – Expenditure of State Funds: Accreditation Expenses & Dues**. The proposed amendment would replace all references of Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) with "institutional accrediting agency" for annual dues or other relative expenses. The proposed amendment is published on the NC Community College System's website, <u>Numbered Memos - NCCCS (nccommunitycolleges.edu)</u>. For your convenience, a copy of the proposed rule, with the changes indicated, is attached to this memorandum. Strikethroughs indicate deletions of existing language and underlines indicate additions of language.

Any member of the public has the right to submit written comments on the proposed rule. Please note that any person who submits public comments on behalf of their community college should comply with their college's local process for submitting comments on a proposed rule. Written comments on the rule must be received by no later than 5:00 p.m. on June 19, 2025. Any member of the public has the right to request a hearing on the proposed rule. Requests for a hearing must be received by no later than 5:00 p.m. on June 4, 2025.

Rationale for proposed adoption, amendment, or repeal:	Recent North Carolina legislation allows community colleges to use accreditors other than SACSCOC. Updating the State Board Code ensures legal compliance as well as providing clear guidance on accreditor selection and maintain system wide accountability and access to federal funding.

8	1H SBCCC 200.6 Expenditure of State Funds: Accreditation Expenses & Dues
9	(a) Accreditation expenses relative to Southern Association of Colleges and Schools
10	Commission on Collegesan institutional accrediting agency may be paid from State
11	funds within the institution's current allotment. These expenses shall be limited to
12	payment of travel, subsistence, lodging, and honorarium incurred by members of
13	visiting committees, other bona fide representatives, and members of the staff of
14	accrediting organizations. This Rule permits payment of only those expenses for
15	which an institution is customarily invoiced by an accrediting organization following a
16	visit.
17	(b) The institution may pay from State funds the required annual dues of the Southern
18	Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Collegesinstitutional accrediting
19	agency, and such institutional association membership dues as the board of trustees
20	deems to benefit the institution. Regarding membership dues in the Southern
21	Association, this Rule applies to annual dues of correspondents and candidates for
22	membership, as well as accredited members.
23	(c) The institution may also pay from State funds the fees for accrediting individual
24	programs offered by the institution if the college president determines that the
25	accreditation provides value to graduates of the program.
