**SUBJECT:** Amendment of 1D SBCCC 200.93 – Faculty

**DATE:** July 22, 2025

On July 18, 2025, the State Board of Community Colleges voted to amend the State Board Code, **1D SBCCC 200.93 – Faculty**. This amendment replaces all mentions of SACSCOC with "institutional accrediting agency" for faculty hiring and teaching standards.

The amendment will be effective August 1, 2025. At that time, the amended rule will be published on the North Carolina Community College System's website, <a href="State Board Code">State Board Code</a> <a href="NCCCS">NCCCS (nccommunitycolleges.edu">NCCCS (nccommunitycolleges.edu</a>). For your convenience, a copy of the rule in its final form is attached to this memorandum.

#### CHAPTER D. EDUCATION PROGRAMS

#### SUBCHAPTER 200. BASIC SKILLS

## 1D SBCCC 200.93 Faculty

- (a) General
  - (1) Colleges shall employ faculty members who meet the established criteria aligned with the institutional accrediting agency.
  - (2) Colleges shall determine appropriate teaching and non-teaching loads for faculty and for technical assistants to the faculty to meet the established criteria of the institutional accrediting agency.
  - (3) The principles and standards from the institutional accrediting agencies in accordance with North Carolina law are hereby adopted for reference.
- (b) Instructors for Extension Emergency Services Training. All instructors in the area of Emergency Services Training must be qualified as established by the respective emergency services certifying agency. Emergency services training means training delivered to personnel in law enforcement, fire and rescue services, and emergency medical services agencies.
