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## I. PURPOSE STATEMENT

North Carolina [G.S. 115D-5\(a\)](#) provides that “[t]he State Board of Community Colleges may adopt and execute such policies, regulations and standards concerning the establishment, administration, and operation of institutions as the State Board may deem necessary ... to provide for the equitable distribution of State and federal funds to the several institutions.” [G.S. 115D-31\(a\)](#) further describes the State Board’s responsibility to provide, “from sources available to the State Board,” financial support to the institutions.

**It is the responsibility of the colleges to ensure that State and Federal funds are expended consistently with the policies herein.**

## **I. Enrollment Growth Reserve Carryforward**

G.S. 115D-31(e) states: “If receipts for community college tuition and fees exceed the amount certified in General Fund Codes at the end of a fiscal year, the State Board of Community Colleges shall transfer the amount of receipts and fees above those budgeted to the Enrollment Growth Reserve. Funds in the Enrollment Growth Reserve shall not revert to the General Fund and shall remain available to the State Board until expended. The State Board may allocate funds in this reserve to colleges experiencing an enrollment increase greater than five percent (5%) of budgeted enrollment levels.”

## **J. Construction Training, Building Careers Carryforward**

This allocation is funded through the State Fiscal Stabilization Funds in the 2021 Appropriations Act (Session Law 2021-180, as amended by S.L. 2021-189).

Section 4.9.(k) of Session Law 2021-180 states that the funds appropriated in this act from the State Fiscal Recovery Fund shall not revert at the end of each fiscal year of the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium but shall remain available to expend until the date set by applicable federal law or guidance.

Colleges receiving these funds are responsible for required reporting to the NC Pandemic Office through the System Office and are subject to State and Federal audit requirements. These funds are also subject to the following requirements in the Uniform Guidance (2 C.F.R. Part 200); 2 C.F.R § 200.303 regarding internal controls, 2 C.F.R. § 200.330 through § 200.332 regarding subrecipient and pass-through entity monitoring and management, and subpart F regarding audit requirements.

Colleges receiving these funds are responsible for abiding by 09 NCAC 03M.0202 through maintaining reports and accounting records that support the allowable expenditures of State funds for five years from the end of the grant agreement. Colleges are required to notify recipients of the purpose of the award and the reporting requirements established by 09 NCAC 03M.0401.

## **L. Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities (IDD) Training Program**

## **M. Child Care**

**Purpose:** The intent of the Child Care Grant is to assist student-parents (both male and female, in-person and online students) with the financial responsibilities for childcare expenses so they may stay enrolled and complete their educational goals. No faculty, staff, or administrator employed by the college may receive or utilize funds from this grant except for qualified “work study” students. Childcare coordinators and financial aid offices shall work collaboratively to ensure that students are aware of the program and that there are no barriers to accessing these funds.

The General Assembly appropriated \$3,038,215 for this program. An initial allocation of \$2,590,513 will be distributed, with the remaining balance retained by the System Office for future allocations to colleges with demonstrated need on a case-by-case basis.

For the Child Care Grant, a childcare provider is a person, business, or organization that provides childcare services to its clients or customers. Examples include:

- Licensed daycare or individual provider
- Unlicensed childcare provider
- Grandparents or other relatives (excluding the child's parent)
- A personal nanny
- Before school or afterschool programs
- Summer programs

**Management of Funds:**

The Child Care Grant is intended to provide direct financial assistance to student-parents for eligible childcare expenses that support their ability to remain enrolled and successfully pursue their educational goals. Colleges should administer these funds in a manner that promotes student success, ensures equitable access, maintains compliance with State Board guidance, and demonstrates responsible stewardship of public resources. Institutions are encouraged to develop processes that facilitate timely support for student-parents while ensuring that all expenditures are properly documented, reasonable, and directly related to childcare services received.

**Fund Disbursement Requirements**

Funds must be disbursed either directly to the childcare provider or to the student-parent only after receipt of:

- A valid invoice from the childcare provider; and
- Student attendance must be confirmed. Attendance may be confirmed electronically through approved institutional systems (e.g., WebAdvisor, CRM, Canvas, etc.).
- Funds may be provided directly to the student-parent solely for the purpose of paying an eligible childcare provider for services rendered with a valid invoice
- Colleges may not pay for childcare services in advance of their delivery.

**Coordination with Other Funding Sources**

- Colleges are encouraged to coordinate with local social services agencies and other community partners to identify existing childcare assistance programs available to student-parents.
- Child Care Grant funds may be used to cover eligible childcare expenses that are not fully covered by social services programs, federal, state, or local grants; or other external funding sources.
- Colleges should ensure that Child Care Grant funds do not duplicate assistance already provided through another funding source.

**Reasonable Cost Standards**

- All childcare expenses must meet a reasonable cost standard based on local market rates.
- Colleges should evaluate invoices to ensure that charges are customary and consistent with the cost of comparable childcare services in the local area.
  - For example: If local childcare providers charge approximately \$200 per week, a grandparent serving as a childcare provider may not invoice an excessive amount, such as \$500 per week, for similar services.

**Student Eligibility Considerations**

To promote equitable access, colleges should establish eligibility criteria that reflect the diverse needs of their student populations. Eligible student-parents may include:

- Full-time students;
- Part-time students;
- Online learners;
- Military-affiliated students;
- Curriculum students and;
- Continuing Education students

**Prohibited Uses of Funds**

Child Care Grant funds may not be used for:

- Compensation to the parent of the child receiving care;
- Advance payment for childcare services not yet rendered;
- Operating costs of a college-operated childcare facility;
- Childcare staff salaries or personnel expenses;
- Administrative overhead expenses, including salaries and benefits for college employees or;
- Any purpose not directly related to providing childcare assistance to eligible student-parents.

**College Childcare Facilities**

- Child Care Grant funds may be used to pay a college-operated childcare center only when the center is acting as the childcare provider for an eligible student-parent participating in the program.
- Other State funds may not be used to subsidize the operation of college childcare facilities or childcare staff positions.

**Stewardship of Funds**

The General Assembly has directed the State Board to allocate these funds specifically to support childcare assistance for student-parents. Colleges are responsible for ensuring that all expenditures align with the purpose of the program and comply with applicable guidance, policies, and fiscal requirements.

## **N. Short-Term Workforce Development**

**Purpose:** Per [GS 115D-10.19](#), the purpose of this funding is to provide financial assistance of up to \$750 per course for [resident students](#) who enroll in non-credit, short-term workforce training programs that lead to an industry-recognized credential in fields with employer demand and competitive wages.

The General Assembly appropriated \$2,000,000 for this program. An initial allocation of \$1,800,000 will be distributed, with the remaining balance retained by the System Office for future allocations to colleges with demonstrated need on a case-by-case basis.
